Holland America Line started out in 1873 as a passenger line taking immigrants to the New World ... and now the cruise line takes people on vacations to all corners of the globe with expertly crafted itineraries, extraordinary service and authentic experiences in each destination. Offering an ideal perfectly-sized ship experience, its fleet visits nearly 400 ports in 114 countries and has shared the thrill of Alaska for more than 75 years — longer than any other cruise line. Holland America Line's 11 vessels feature a diverse range of enriching activities and amenities focused on destination immersion and personalized travel. Guests enjoy the best live music at sea each evening and dining venues featuring exclusive dishes by world-famous chefs. A new global fresh fish program brings more than 80 types of fresh fish on board, sourced and served locally in regions around the world. Holland America Line is part of Carnival Corporation and plc (NYSE/LSE:CCL and NYSE:CUK).

FUN FACTS:

- The only cruise line to take guests into the Yukon Territory on an overland Cruisetour, as well as more sailings to Glacier Bay National Park than any other cruise line.
- Named the exclusive cruise line partner of the Professional Pickleball Association (PPA). All ships have a pickleball court on board with a dedicated sports director.
- Since 2006, more than half a million participants have participated in On Deck for a Cause in more than 8,400 walks aboard with proceeds supporting various philanthropic organizations.
- First cruise line to have been awarded Responsible Fisheries Management (RFM) certification, serving fresh, certified sustainable and traceable wild Alaska seafood.
- Ships serve more than 2,000 pounds of Alaska salmon, 1,000 pounds of Alaska cod, 800 pounds of Alaska halibut, and 500 pounds of Alaska rockfish on an average seven-day Alaskan cruise.
- Has more sailings 16 nights and longer than any other brand in or out of the U.S. and is the only brand to have more than 100 cruises in the Caribbean for 11 nights or longer.
- Holland America Line offers more longer cruises roundtrip from a North America homeport than anyone, visiting 225 different ports in 91 different countries on round-trip North American sailings.
- The company's Fresh Fish Program engages a global network of 60 ports to source and serve 80 types of fresh fish on board in all restaurants, going from port to plate in less than 48 hours.
- Since the company was founded, it has never sailed without a ship named Rotterdam in the fleet. Holland America Line has had seven ships named Rotterdam, including its first ocean liner, which sailed its maiden voyage from Rotterdam to New York City on Oct. 15, 1872. The company's most recent ship, delivered in 2021, is named Rotterdam.
- The line was a principal carrier of immigrants from Europe to the United States from the 1880s to the 1920s, taking 850,000 passengers to new lives in the New World.
- In 1895, the company offered its first vacation cruise. Its second leisure cruise — from New York to the Holy Land — was in 1910.
- More than one-million specialty coffee drinks are served on the ships annually, including those from Grand Dutch Café.
- More than 60,000 flower arrangements are created for cruises during the year.
- The famous Orange Party on every cruise celebrates Holland America Line's Dutch Heritage and is a nod to the Dutch Royal Family – the House of Orange-Nassau.
- Twelve Holland America Line ships have been launched by a member of the Dutch Royal Family, starting with Prince Hendrik launching Statendam III in 1929.

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
