

SCARBOROUGH, **TOBAGO**



TOBAGO ISLAND EXPLORER







Activity Level: Easy Approximately **7 hours**

Board air-conditioned transportation for a drive through Scarborough to Fort King George, built in the 1770s and occupied until the late 1800s. Today it features fantastic panoramic views and a museum that displays weapons and pre-Columbian artifacts. Continue along the Windward Coast Road, passing through several villages, to the **Pembroke Heritage Park** for a guided tour. On the way to a quaint beachside restaurant, you will stop at a picturesque overlook. Savor a typical Caribbean lunch on the beach before returning to the ship.

TOBAGO RAIN FOREST ADVENTURE





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **5 hours**

Transfer to a rain forest trailhead and follow your local naturalist guide on a three-hour hike. They will point out plants and trees used for food and medicinal purposes. After your walk in the shade of some beautiful flora, return to the starting point and transfer back to the ship.

TOBAGO GLASS-BOTTOM BOAT & BUCCOO REEF SNORKEL





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 3 hours

Take a 15-minute transfer along the Claude Noel Highway to Pigeon Point Beach. Hop aboard a glassbottom boat and head out to Buccoo Reef. On the way, your skipper will pass over the Coral Gardens and point out the fish and coral life. Anchor over the reef and hop into the water to swim or snorkel and explore the marine life up close. Continue to the **Nylon Pool** - a sandbank out at sea where you can swim in a protected, pool-like area. You'll pass the lagoon as you head back to the landing at Pigeon Point Beach.

TOBAGO SOUTH





Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **3 hours**

A drive along the Claude Noel Highway brings you to the Mysterious Tombstone and then to the small fortification of Fort James. Pass by the hotel district, Mt. Irvine Bay and the golf course on the way to the town of Store Bay. At Fort King George, dating back to the 1770s, an interesting museum displays weapons and pre-Columbian artifacts. The views from here are simply outstanding. Rejoining the Claude Noel Highway, you will pass through the main shopping area of Scarborough en route back to the ship.

TOBAGO HIGHLIGHTS & FOLKLORIC SHOW





Activity Level: Easy
Approximately 3.5 hours

A panoramic drive through Scarborough, the capital of Tobago, leads you to Fort King George. Visit the museum that displays weapons and other pre-Columbian artifacts. View the Mysterious Tombstone and head to the small fortification of Fort James. Pass many upscale hotels and drive through the picturesque grounds of the Mt. Irvine Bay Hotel and Golf Course on the way to Store Bay. You'll stop at the Canaan/Bon Accord Cultural Centre, where a beverage is provided as you watch a fascinating and colorful folkloric show.

BEST OF SANTARÉM





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 4.75 hours

Hop on a local intercity bus at the main square in Alter do Chão, and travel for approximately 45 minutes to Santarém. Stop at the Mercadão 2000 market, and then in the town center visit the Cathedral of Our Lady of Conceição and Fishermen's Square, where free time is allocated for shopping. Heading out of town, you will stop at the Manioc Flour House, locally known as Casa da Farinha. Continue out of town into rural Brazil and back to Alter do Chão, where you tour ends with free time to browse in town among the Araribá shops.

TAPAJÓS NATIONAL FOREST





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **4.5 hours**

Travel 40 miles along the Santarém-Cuiabá Highway, the only way to reach southern Brazil by road. Your destination is Tapajós National Forest, a section of the Brazilian Amazon that is a major source of tropical hardwoods. Protected by federal law, the forest covers an area of 1,482,660 acres. Take a forest walk lasting about two hours - ideal for those who are interested in the primary forest flora. Jungle guides will accompany you to help identify many different species of trees, including Brazil nut and rubber trees.

PINK DOLPHIN ENCOUNTER





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 5 hours

Set out on an approximately 90-minute **speedboat** scenic cruise upstream on the Rio Negro. At a community on the shores of Lake Acajatuba you will have the opportunity to see and touch its famous pink dolphins as you stand on a submerged platform and your guide hand-feeds these amazing creatures. Check out the village lifestyle as you browse for local handicrafts before returning to the pier by boat.

RUBBER REALITY & INDIGENOUS VILLAGE



Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **6 hours**

A regional **riverboat** takes you up the Rio Negro to visit an indigenous village. Following a reception that includes rituals performed by the shaman (priest) and the tribe, you'll continue by boat to visit Seringal Felicidade. After a brief introduction to the rubber industry here, you'll have time to walk the trails and learn firsthand the history of the rubber boom and its eventual collapse. The Rubber Museum in the middle of the jungle is a replica rubber estate. The plantation also features some Brazil nut trees and displays articles and equipment from the rubber industry heyday.

OFF THE BEATEN TRACK: AMAZON JUNGLE TREK





Leave Manaus by regional riverboat, crossing the Rio Negro and heading into the jungle. Your indigenous guide and bilingual interpreter will tell you about life in the wild: how to obtain water and make fire, grow crops and hunt animals, how to get your bearings and how to hike easily in the jungle. You will learn about building shelters and traps and some basic rules of jungle survival.

BEST OF MANAUS







Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **6.5 hours**

Pass the Customs House on your way to meet inhabitants of the Amazon region at the **Bosque** da Ciência, an open-air museum and Amazonian Research Station. Observe endangered Amazon River manatees in a glass tank and other indigenous flora and fauna, as well as an exhibit of scientific projects under development. Visit the Military Zoo and stop for lunch at a barbecue restaurant. The highlight of your tour is the lavish Opera House, Teatro Amazonas. Built in 1896, the dazzling auditorium boasts perfect acoustics and a dome of 36,000 imported ceramic tiles.

FLORA & FAUNA OF MANAUS





Activity Level: Strenuous
Approximately 4 hours

Visit Bosque da Ciência, an open-air museum and Amazonian Research Station whose most famous project is the species revival of the endangered Amazon River manatee. Observe these strange creatures as they swim in a glass tank, and explore an indoor exhibit of scientific projects under development. You'll see other indigenous flora and fauna housed here. You'll also visit the Military Zoo, where wildlife and Amazonian fauna are housed.



PARINTINS, **BRAZIL**



THE BOI BUMBA FESTIVAL SHOW





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 1.5 hours

The must-see **Boi Bumba**, one of the greatest folk festivals in Brazil, is a feast for the senses. This world full of magic, bright colors, music, dance and folklore boasts luxurious costumes and floats comparable to Rio's Carnival. The 60-minute show features approximately 60 dancers and musicians telling the story of feuding families and is performed at a local club or at the Convention Center. A local caipirinha drink will be served, and there may be an opportunity to purchase souvenirs outside the Convention Center. Tour is not guided.

PARINTINS BY TRICICLO





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **1.5 hours**

Cruise along the colorful streets of Parintins by triciclo. This compact form of transportation translates as "tricycle," but it's not a trike. Each triciclo takes one or two quests, and the experience is like riding in a tuk-tuk in Asia. Meet the locals and experience regional culture on a 90-minute ride past the major highlights of the city. You will stop for photos at the Caprichoso Pavilion, Liberty Square and the Bumbódromo, where the annual Boi Bumba festival is held. Step inside the cathedral before you head along the shoreline back to the pier.

SANTARÉM HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.5 hours

Drive along Santarém's bustling waterfront and stop at the Municipal Market, Fisherman's Square, the Cathedral of Our Lady Conceição, and the João Fona Museum, housed in the old Town Hall. Observe the Meeting of the Waters, where the muddy Amazon River and the blue waters of the Rio Tapajós flow side by side. A short drive into the countryside brings you to an old manioc flour factory. Return to Santarém and the ship.

MAICA LAKE & PIRANHA FISHING





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately **2.5 hours**

Board a regional boat for a cruise to the Meeting of the Waters, where the Amazon and Tapajós rivers come together and flow side by side for many miles before their distinctive colors meld. Continue to Maica Lake. where the beautiful landscape showcases the Amazon Basin. You will see the local inhabitants as well as many species of birds and, possibly, a freshwater dolphin. You'll stop to **fish** for the famous **piranha**, an amazing fish whose nasty reputation is well-earned.



SAINT GEORGE'S, **GRENADA**



THE BEST OF GRENADA







Activity Level: Easy Approximately 7 hours

Journey to Fort Frederick and continue to Grand **Etang**, a cobalt-blue crater lake situated at 1,900 feet above sea level in an extinct volcano. Enjoy a refreshing drink. At **River Antoine Estate** view the oldest functioning water wheel in the Western Hemisphere and experience the rum-making process (and sample some of the finished product) on a guided factory tour. Next, relax and enjoy lunch at Belmont **Estate** and tour the cocoa **fermentary** and the estate museum. Visit the **Dougaldston Spice Estate**, a historic monument and tribute to Grenada's past. Continue past several villages and Brizan and Beauséjour bays before returning to port.

GRENADA ISLAND DRIVE





Activity Level: Easy Approximately 4 hours

A scenic island drive heads through St. George's to plantations of cocoa and spices. You'll visit two seaside villages. At Grenville visit a nutmeg station to see the processing of Grenada's fragrant crops. Turn inland to visit the National Park Nature Center at Grand Etang, resting at 1,900 feet above sea level in the crater of an extinct volcano. On the descent you'll pass through magnificent hanging carpets of mountain fern and quaint villages before returning to St. George's pier.



ISLE OF SPICE SNORKELING





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 2.75 hours

Travel along Grenada's picturesque coastline aboard Star Wind 5, a spacious, 60-foot catamaran sloop. Your day begins with a short walk to Queen's Jetty, just steps away from the cruise ship terminal. Hop aboard for a journey that showcases all the beauty that Grenada has to offer, above and below the surface. You will sail north along Grenada's west coast to **snorkel** in Flamingo Bay. Further south visit a beautiful white-sand beach to swim or simply relax.

GRENADA MOUNTAIN RAIN FOREST





Activity Level: Easy Approximately 3.75 hours

Pass through quaint villages before arriving at Beauséjour Bay, where the United States frogmen came ashore during the military intervention in 1983. Stop at Dougaldston Spice Estate, an integral facet of Grenada's past, and take the Belvedere Road to Grand **Etang Lake**, lying in the crater of an extinct volcano. At Annandale take a short, steep walk to see some of Grenada's 450 species of flowering and medicinal plants. Travel to Fort Frederick for a panoramic view of the harbor and then return to the pier.

RHUM RUNNER PLEASURE CRUISE





Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **3 hours**

A steel band and a cold rum punch greet you on the Rhum Runner. Learn about the history, geography, architecture and customs of the island as the **boat** loops around the inner harbor. Disembark at Morne Rouge Beach for 1.5 hours of relaxation. On the return trip take part in a limbo competition to win prizes of t-shirts and rum punch. Rum punch, soft drinks, fresh fruits, crackers and cheese are served. Freshwater showers and restroom facilities are available on board.

Activity Level: Easy Approximately 5.5 hours

Step into Chef Helmi Smeulders' kitchen, where the Caribbean Spice Girl welcomes you with refreshments. She will share with you samples of all kinds of Caribbean fruits and vegetables as well as food preparation tips and tricks. Then help prepare lunch in a hands-on cooking class. When the cooking is done, enjoy the fruits of your labor accompanied by a glass of wine. You'll return to the ship with a host of new recipes and a newfound appreciation of Caribbean cuisine.

ULTIMATE CURAÇAO, BEACH & TURTLE SNORKEL WITH LUNCH







Journey through the Curação countryside and past historical plantation houses before taking a light hike on the rugged north coast. Visit the beach and viewpoint at West Point, where you can swim here or join your guide for snorkeling in the bay. Look for sea turtles in their natural habitat. At Knip Beach enjoy free time and a light boxed picnic lunch, then swim or stroll along the sand. On the way back, stop briefly at the salt flats, the domain of wild flamingos.

AUTHENTICALLY CURAÇAO





View historic mansions as you travel through Willemstad. Travel over the tallest bridge in the Caribbean, 185 feet above sea level. Stop at Chobolobo, where Blue Curação has been produced since 1886, and enjoy a guided tour of the distillery and a sample of the liqueur. Next visit the Aloe Vera Farm, learn about the process of making aloe products and taste aloe juice. At Chichis' Workshop, local women make unique sculptures and paint them in tropical colors. Then drive though Punda, the oldest part of Willemstad, before returning to your ship.

MINI-4X4 ADVENTURE & BEACH BREAK





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.75 hours

Get behind the wheel of an award-winning off-road vehicle and follow your tour guide, caravan-style. On a desert-style trail you'll see different types of cacti and may even spot an iquana or the local prikichi parrot. Visit a natural attraction called the **blowhole** and drive along the coast. At a lovely **beach** take a refreshing **swim** or relax in the shade. On your return to Willemstad you may stay in town to **shop** or explore independently, making your own way back to the ship.

CURAÇAO LAND & SEA





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **2.5 hours**

Board the Seaworld Explorer semi-sub and view sea life through large windows, passing over a wall that drops sharply several hundred feet. Back on land, cross the Queen Juliana Bridge for a view of Willemstad from 200 feet above the town. Continue to the Chobolobo **Liqueur Factory** for a taste of the world-famous Curação liqueur. Back in Willemstad, you may stay in town to **shop** or explore independently, making your own way back to the ship.



QUEPOS, **COSTA RICA**



DOLPHIN AND WHALE-WATCHING WITH CRAFT BREWERY LUNCH







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **7 hours**

Drive south to Parque Nacional Marino Ballena and board a whale-watching boat to search for humpback whales. Also keep an eye out for other marine mammals, sea turtles and seabirds as well as natural rock formations and marine caves. After your boat adventure drive to the beach town of Dominical to visit the Fuego Brew Company and enjoy craft beer and lunch overlooking beautiful gardens. You may visit the beachfront market nearby to purchase colorful local handicrafts.

MANUEL ANTONIO NATIONAL PARK







Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **4.25 hours**

On a 1.5-hour guided walk along small trails through the dense rain forest of this park, your naturalist guide acquaints you with facts about its abundance of wildlife and more than a thousand different species of flora. This popular walk lets you experience the forest that kisses the beach and allows free time for **swimming** inside the park. Afterwards, you may stay in town to shop or explore independently and make your own way back to the ship.

TROPICAL FOREST AERIAL TRAM







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 7 hours

Hop into a comfortable **gondola** with a maximum of eight passengers for a one-hour ride with a bilingual naturalist guide who will point out plants, birds and wildlife usually hidden in this lush paradise. Next, a guided nature walk reveals the forest floor, and a video presentation explains the dry forest. Visit the Butterfly Garden, the Medicinal & Aromatic Plants Garden

and the reptile-inhabited terrariums. Enjoy a traditional Costa Rican lunch at the Nature Café, and visit the gift shop for a variety of local and handmade arts, crafts and designs as well as souvenirs.

SAVEGRE RIVER FLOATING ADVENTURE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately **5 hours**

Pass by teak plantations, stopping briefly to look for toucans and macaws, on your way to the town of Santo Domingo. There your bilingual guides offer an orientation to the river, considered one of the most beautiful rivers of Central America. Your two-hour river float reveals beautiful landscapes, including some native African palm oil plantations, and wildlife including white ibis, cormorants, egrets and herons. You'll experience moments of both exhilarating action and relaxation.

MANGROVE WILDLIFE & BOAT CRUISE







Your tour begins with a shoreside introduction of this special habitat. On a two-hour boat tour your naturalistguide will identify wildlife hiding in the aerial root system of the mangroves or lurking in the water beneath you. In the upper canopy of the forest that lines the shore you will see monkeys and a great variety of birds. Refreshments are served along the way. Upon your return, you may head back to the ship by coach, or stay in town to **shop** or explore independently and make your own way back to the ship.

Lush forest provides a spectacular backdrop to this area accessible only by sea. From the charming village of Yelpa take a horseback ride to some beautiful creeks and enjoy a swim in the refreshing river water if you wish. Next, enjoy the relaxed pace of life in Pizota village, a tiny settlement well off the radar of most travelers. Its spectacular beach provides a marvelous snorkeling and kayaking location.

SIERRA MADRE JEEP® SAFARI & **MOUNTAIN RESORT**







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately **5 hours**

Led by an experienced guide, set out caravan-style in open-air Jeeps to explore Puerto Vallarta's scenic countryside. Drive into the Sierra Madre Mountains and through typical Mexican villages, stopping at the Hacienda Doña Engracia tequila factory to learn about the tequila-making process. Then visit La Dulce Vista mountain villa resort to enjoy an hour to swim in the pool, nap in a hammock or purchase a cold beverage (at your own expense). A delicious snack of two beef or **chicken tacos** is included. Finally, pass fruit plantations and small villages as you return to the ship.

You will roast 10 ounces of coffee to your personal taste, package and take it home with you. Browse the gift shop and showroom for Kona Joe products, original artwork, signature clothing and custom jewelry before returning to the pier.

CAPTAIN ZODIAC RAFTING & SNORKEL ADVENTURE







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **3.5 hours**

On this **Zodiac** exploration of the Kona coast you will learn about Hawaii's history and seek out marine life on the way to **Kealakekua Bay**, site of the Captain Cook Monument, accessible only by boat. Snorkeling instructions and gear are provided before you hop into the calm waters of this marine preserve, home to hundreds of varieties of tropical fish and coral formations. Enjoy a tropical snack while listening to tales of the bay's history and Captain Cook's encounters with the Hawaiians.

KONA HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **3.5 hours**

Visit Kona's Painted Church. known for its dramatic murals. Travel to Pu'uhonua o Honaunau, or the Place of Refuge. This National Historical Park was a refuge where absolution would be granted to ancient Hawaiian law-breakers and vanquished warriors if they were fortunate enough to get here ahead of their

pursuers. Today the park features attractive grounds and interesting displays of Hawaiian artifacts. Stop at the Royal Kona Coffee store for a sample of coffee before returning to the pier.

A TASTE OF KONA







At Kokoleka Lani Farms explore a grove of cacao trees. learn about the cacao-to-cocoa transformation. and sample locally made dark chocolate. Next visit the Kona Natural Soap Company, whose products contain local ingredients such as Kona coffee, cacao and kukui nut oil. Learn how Kona coffee is grown and processed at Kona Joe Coffee Farm and see its on-site roasting facility. Enjoy a cup of gourmet Kona coffee and a special coffee bean treat and take home a souvenir Kona Joe coffee mug. Conclude with a drive along the coastline and through the heart of Kona town.

Next visit Hawaii Island's only winery, Volcano Winery, nestled on Kilauea's slopes. Here enjoy a wine tasting of Volcano Winery's signature wines. Conclude with a stop at **Big Island Candies**, known for its handmade macadamia nut shortbread cookies dipped in chocolate.

HAWAII VOLCANOES NATIONAL PARK & MAUNA LOA MACADAMIA NUT FACTORY





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **4.5 hours**

Visit Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, lying 4,300 feet above sea level and encompassing Kilauea Volcano. See the results of Hawaii's newest eruptions from Kilauea Iki Overlook and step inside the **Visitor Center** to learn about the forces at work here. Walk along the volcanic ridge and explore the natural steam vents. Later, enjoy a drive through macadamia nut orchards as you approach the Mauna Loa Macadamia Nut Factory. Enjoy free time to shop for an array of island treats and gifts, including an exclusive selection of Mauna Loa products found nowhere else.

VOLCANO WINERY TASTING EXPERIENCE



Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

Visit Volcano Winery, America's southernmost winery. Take a tour of this facility, perched 4,000 feet above sea level in the middle of volcano country. Tropical fruits such as yellow guava and the exotic jaboticaba berry are blended with traditional wine grapes to create vibrant wines. The tour includes a premium wine tasting paired with gourmet cheese and crackers.

HAWAII VOLCANOES NATIONAL PARK & RAINBOW FALLS





Climb through a lush rain forest in your air-conditioned minibus to Volcanoes National Park. Travel along portions of Crater Rim Drive and Chain of Craters Road for breathtaking views of twisted lava rock flows, sulfur banks and lava beds as well as Kilauea Caldera and Halema'uma'u Crater. At the **Visitor Center** you can explore exhibits explaining the history and geology of Hawaii's volcanoes. Before returning to the pier visit the iconic 80-foot-tall **Rainbow Falls**, surrounded by tropical flora.

THE LAND OF FROZEN FIRE





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **6.5 hours**

"Go with the flow!" is the mantra on Hawaii, where the local people are used to daily volcanic eruptions as Pele (the volcano goddess) demonstrates the raw power of nature. Volcanoes such as Kilauea can both destroy and create - a plurality that is spectacularly on display in the lower east rift zone of the Big Island. Here, the 2014 and 2018 eruptions created the island's newest blacksand beach. You'll also stop at one of Puna's most iconic landmarks, the Painted Church. Enjoy a shopping stop in charming downtown **Hilo** to sample and purchase local goods before returning to the pier.

HONOLULU, HAWAII



PEARL HARBOR, HONOLULU & THE MIGHTY MO





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6.5 hours

Visit Pearl Harbor and the Arizona Memorial. At the Arizonα Memorial Visitor Center, view a 20-minute film depicting the events of the 1941 Pearl Harbor attack. Then spend 1.5 hours on your own exploring the battleship USS Missouri, the Mighty Mo, where the Japanese signed the surrender document that ended World War II in the Pacific. On your way back to the ship, enjoy a drive by the highlights of metropolitan Honolulu, including the famous Punchbowl Crater.

BEYOND THE CALL TO DUTY: PEARL HARBOR MUSEUMS & MEMORIALS







Activity Level: **Easy** Approximately **9 hours**

Visit key historic moments from World War II in the Pacific. Following an introductory video you'll step into the life of a sailor at the USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park. At Ford Island climb aboard the USS Missouri battleship, the Mighty Mo, visit fighter planes on display at the **Pearl Harbor Aviation** Museum and see the exhibit on Amelia Earhart. Enjoy lunch at the museum, and conclude with a drive past some of Honolulu's top landmarks.



EXPLORE & TASTE OAHU'S NORTH SHORE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6.5 hours

Your guide provides information about Hawaii as you travel to **Byodo Temple**, located at the base of the 2,000-foot-high cliffs of the Koolau Mountain Range. Travel along the scenic shoreline to Kahuku, home of North Shore shrimp farms. Stop for **lunch** before arriving at **Sunset Beach**, famous for its towering surf and many international surfing contests. Watch for views of Hawaii's last pineapple fields en route to the Dole Pineapple **Plantation**, then return to the cruise ship pier.

FAMOUS OAHU SIGHTS, BITES & SIPS







Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **6.75 hours**

Enjoy an Oahu day tour sure to stimulate your senses. Your sightseeing venture ranges from beautiful vantage points overlooking the dramatic southeastern coastline to ones perched along the rugged Pali mountains. Delve into the culinary side of Hawaii as well: You will visit a **restaurant** featured in the television show Diners, Drive-Ins, & Dives, experiencing some favorite local dishes. Then relax with a local chocolate and artisanal wine tasting.

GERMAINE'S LUAU





Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **5.75 hours**

Prepare for a sensational evening of traditional Hawaiian food, entertainment and fun at a luau. This popular Hawaiian-style beach party awaits you at a beachfront setting at sunset. After being welcomed with a Hawaiian shell lei and torch lighting, watch the ancient Imu Ceremony. The buffet-style luau dinner consists of a bounty of delicious native foods and includes one drink ticket. A Polynesian Show and Samoan Fire Knife Dancer and dancing under the stars follows the meal.

GUAM, **U.S. TERRITORY**



HAGATNA HIGHLIGHTS & LATTE STONE PARK





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **3 hours**

Depart the pier for the scenic drive to the Asan Bay Overlook. Next you'll proceed to Asan Beach Park, part of the War in the Pacific National Historic Park. You'll also visit Latte Stone Park and its fascinating stone pillars. Continue to Plaza de España, once the seat of government for the Spanish, American and Japanese administrations. Your last stop today is **Chamorro** Village, located next to the Hagatna Boat Basin and Paseo Stadium. This little shopping village features a variety of local foods and offers a glimpse into the island's culture, lifestyle and cuisine.

GAAN POINT & FORT SOLEDAD





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

Begin your tour at Gaan Point (Old Spanish Bridge), soaking up Guam's tropical beauty as you learn about Guam's role in World War II at the War in the Pacific National Historic Park. View the double-arched Talifak Bridge, a prime example of Spanish architecture from



1785, surrounded by idyllic gardens. Next proceed to Umatac Bay to see the Magellan Monument, honoring the explorer who discovered Guam in 1521. Pause for photos here before continuing to Fort Soledad for breathtaking vistas of the surrounding landscape and ancient cannons pointing toward Magellan's landing spot. Before returning to the ship explore **Jeff's Pirates** Cove, a favorite beach hangout dating back to 1953.



SAIPAN, NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS, **U.S. TERRITORY**



SAIPAN NORTHERN HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

Today you will marvel at the sheer rock formation known as Suicide Cliff, a conservation area and home to many endangered species. In 1944 this area was part of the Battle of Saipan. The remaining 4,000 Japanese soldiers on the island made a final charge as U.S. forces moved to secure nearby Marpi Point and its airfield. Suicide Cliff and Banzai Cliff, which flank Marpi Point, are on the National Register of Historic Places, After departing Marpi Point, you will travel to Garapan Village, with a stop at the American Memorial Park to visit the Court of Honor and the Visitors Center.

SAIPAN SOUTHERN HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

Visit the sites of the south side of Saipan, where nearly 80 years ago American troops landed on Red, Green, Blue and Yellow beaches. Your first stop will be the old Japanese jail where historians believe the famous aviatrix Amelia Earhart was held captive. Traveling on, you may observe the hills where Japanese Capt. Oba hid out for another 15 months after the island was secured by the Americans. Quartermaster Road leads you to the Red and Green landing beaches. Next you will visit Agingan Point and the old Aslito airfield complex. Finally, visit the American Memorial Park in Garapan.





ISHIGAKI, JAPAN NAHA, OKINAWA, JAPAN,

ISHIGAKI, **JAPAN**



HIGHLIGHTS OF ISHIGAKI







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6 hours

Drive to the Tamatorizaki Observatory, located on Hirakubo Peninsula, and then visit Yoneko-yaki Pottery for an introduction to Shisa, a mythical creature believed to protect against evil. Stop at a local crafts studio to learn about the famous Minsa textiles. Next, Kabira Bay features a white-sand beach and emerald-colored water home to beautiful corals and more than 90 different kinds of tropical fish. A souvenir outlet here offers a limited number of Japanese-made black pearl products, difficult to find in other places. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant along the way.

ISHIGAKI CULTURE & CRAFTS





Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **3.5 hours**

Travel to Kabira Bay, designated as a Place of Scenic Beauty, featuring powder-white sand, dense vegetation and turquoise and emerald-green waters. Continue to Ishigaki Pottery Studio to see fine examples of

yutekitenmoku. Browse in the gift shop for unique ceramics decorated with natural ocean-colored Okinawa glass. Next, visit a local craft studio to learn about Minsa, a centuries-old, traditional Ishigaki textile bearing a customary pattern with horizontal lines and groups of small rectangles. Try hand-dying a handkerchief or scarf using the dye from plants that grow wild on Ishigaki.

ISHIGAKI NATURAL WONDERS





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **4 hours**

Travel to **Kabira Bay**, designated as a Place of Scenic Beauty, featuring powder-white sand, dense vegetation and turquoise and emerald-green waters. Discover the bay's underwater treasures by glass-bottom **boat**, observing fish, giant clams and coral reefs in the transparent waters. Next, drive to Ishigaki Yaima **Village**, an open-air museum of old traditional houses moved from elsewhere on the island and reassembled here. Proceed to the Ishigaki Limestone Cave where spacious caverns create a vast network of tunnels and chambers with fascinating geological formations.



NAHA, OKINAWA, JAPAN

GYOKUSENDO CAVE & PEACE MEMORIAL MUSEUM





Activity Level: Moderate
Approximately 5 hours

Walk through Gyokusendo Cave, a 2-mile-long cave renowned for its intricate limestone formations and underground streams. Continue to the Okinawa Prefectural Peace Memorial Museum on Mabuni Hill commemorating the 1945 Battle of Okinawa, a fierce battle that claimed the lives of more than 200,000 people. Here also visit the Cornerstone of Peace at Memorial Park which, along with numerous monuments, stands as a symbol of who lost their lives in the war.

SHURIJO CASTLE PARK. **GARDEN AND KOKUSAI STREET**





Activity Level: Moderate
Approximately 4 hours

Shurijo Castle Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site showing strong Chinese architectural influence, is home to the Shurei-mon Gate, the symbol of Okinawa. You'll also see the Sonohyan Utaki-Ishimon Gate and visit the Shikinaen Garden, both UNESCO World Heritage sites. Then enjoy free time strolling along Kokusai Street, an area that combines cosmopolitan flavor with genuine folk appeal. You will find souvenirs and other goods for sale in the local stores.

RYUKYUMURA VILLAGE. CAPE MANZAMO & KOKUSAI STREET





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **6 hours**

Ryukyu Village, a reproduction of an ancient Okinawan village, provides an introduction to Okinawan culture. Sample Okinawan cuisine (at your own expense); view exhibits showcasing traditional festivals, cuisine and crafts; and watch villagers create traditional fabrics. Visit Cape Manzamo for superb views, and then enjoy free time

strolling along Kokusai Street, an area that combines cosmopolitan flavor with genuine folk appeal. You will find souvenirs and other goods for sale in the local stores.

BATTLE OF OKINAWA





Visit Peace Memorial Park, located in the southern part of Okinawa's "mainland," where the last conflicts of the Battle of Okinawa occurred. The Peace Memorial Museum, established in 2000, interprets a range of individual war experiences in an effort to convey the devastation of war and the importance of human life. Next, you'll visit the former Japanese Naval **Headquarters**, set in an underground shelter. At the end of the war. Commander Minoru Ohta and other officers committed suicide in the shelter. It remains unaltered to this day.

OKINAWA IN DEPTH





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 8 hours

Visit the Okinawa Prefectural Peace Memorial Museum on Mabuni Hill. The Cornerstone of Peace is located where one of the fiercest battles occurred. Together with numerous marble monuments at Memorial Park, it symbolizes the loss of life here. Next, walk through the amazing Gyokusendo Cave, renowned for its intricate limestone formations. Visit the Shikinaen Garden, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, originally built in 1799 for Ryukyu royalty. Enjoy a brief introduction to Naha's commercial heart with a drive along Kokusai **Street** and enjoy free time strolling through the area.

TOKYO, JAPAN OMAEZAKI, JAPAN

TOKYO, JAPAN



FUJI-HAKONE NATIONAL PARK, LAKE ASHI CRUISE & MT. FUJI VIEW







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 8.75 hours

Take the Mt. Komagatake Aerial Cableway to the mountaintop's observation platform, providing a panoramic view of Mt. Fuji and Lake Ashi, Mt. Futago and the mountains of the Izu Peninsula. At the western base of Komagatake, gardens feature alpine plants, wild azaleas and rhododendrons. Hop aboard one of the boats that ply the waters of Lake Ashi, and then visit the Hakone Open-Air Museum, housing sculptures by artists from all over the world.

THE BEST OF TOKYO





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 7.5 hours

Visit the Meiji Shrine, a tribute to Emperor Meiji of the late 1800s. It features twin 40-foot-tall torii gates, among the largest in Japan. Head to the Imperial Palace Plaza in central Tokyo, home to the Fushimiyagura watchtower, ruins from the Edo Period, and the famous Nijubashi Bridge. Visit Asakusa, the location of the beautiful Senso-ji, or Kannon Temple, enshrining a golden image of the Buddhist goddess Kannon. Enjoy lunch at a deluxe local restaurant or hotel. Afterwards, enjoy about an hour to shop in the legendary Ginza shopping district.

TOKYO CITY LANDMARKS





Visit the famous and beautiful Meiji Shrine, a tribute to Emperor Meiji of the late 1800s. It features twin 40-foot-tall torii gates, among the largest in Japan. Passing through the organized chaos of the Shibuya Crossing intersection, you'll head to the Zojoji Temple. Originally built in A.D. 1393, it was moved to its present location in 1598 by Tokugawa Ieyasu. Six of

the Tokugawa shoguns are buried on this site. Enjoy a panoramic drive through the city before returning to the ship.

PANORAMIC TOKYO & IMPERIAL PALACE PLAZA VIEW





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 2.5 hours

Enjoy a panoramic drive through metropolitan Tokyo, crossing the 800-yard-long Rainbow suspension bridge. See the Odiba Fuji TV Building with its spherical observatory, the Tokyo Tower, the State Guest Houses and the House of Parliament. You'll stop near the **Imperial Palace Plaza** to view the park that surrounds the emperor's palace. On its north side a fountain commemorates the marriage of the Emperor and Empress. To the south stands a bronze statue of Kusunoki Masashige, a 14th-century samurai. A drive past the Ginza district and the Kabbukiza Theatre completes your tour.



OMAEZAKI, **JAPAN**



SUNPU CASTLE PARK & SHIZUOKA SENGEN SHRINE





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **5.25 hours**

Sunpu Castle Park contains the remains of the castle, built in 1585, whose moats and stone walls can still be seen. Visit the castle's restored gate and turret and a reference library. Continue to Shizuoka Sengen Shrine, a complex of seven shrines. Sengen Shrine is noted for its dramatic architectural style and extensive use of gold leaf, lacquer and wood carvings. Last, head to Yaizu Fish Market, boasting shops selling fresh seafood such as tuna, bonito and dried or processed fish, as well as a variety of different tea sellers.

NIHONDAIRA OUTLOOK & **KUNOZAN TOSHOGU SHRINE**





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **6 hours**

Nihondaira Overlook, a prefecture natural park, affords panoramic vistas of Suruga Bay and Mt. Fuji. Board an aerial ropeway for bird's-eye views as you travel up the mountainside to the Kunozan Toshogu **Shrine**. The shrine complex features ornately decorated vermilion buildings. Continue to Shaden, the main



building, comprised of three architecturally diverse and elaborately decorated sections. Last, visit the Yaizu Fish Market, boasting shops selling fresh seafood such as tuna, bonito and dried or processed fish, as well as a variety of different tea sellers.

KAKEGAWA CASTLE & KASUISAI TEMPLE





Activity Level: Moderate
Approximately 5 hours

Visit Kasuisai Temple, established in 1394 and featuring several buildings including a main hall, shoin and abbot's residence. It is also known as the flower temple for its perfect spring peonies, white Japanese orchids in summer and fall maple leaves. Kakegawa Castle, originally built in 1513, features sections reconstructed using original methods in 1994. Due to its historical significance, the site is included on the 100 Fine Castles of Japan list. Conclude with a stop at Roadside Station Kakegawa, with free time to stroll about and purchase souvenirs.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OMAEZAKI





Visit Ochanosato Museum, featuring exhibits introducing the tea industry, its history and culture and including a tea ceremony house and garden. Next visit Horai Bridge, the world's longest wooden pedestrian bridge at over half a mile long. Finally, arrive at Oganeke, a family residence built about 300 years ago. The main building and gate are both designated as National Important Cultural Properties. Enjoy the seasonal flowers in the garden and the views of Mt. Fuji and Suruga Bay in the distance.

KOBE (OSAKA), JAPAN FUKUOKA, JAPAN

KOBE (OSAKA), **JAPAN**



KYOTO. THE ANCIENT CAPITAL







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 9 hours

A city of profound history and rich tradition, Kyoto represents the soul of Japan. The Kinkaku-ji Temple. originally built in 1397, was reconstructed in 1955, faithful to the 14th-century design. Next visit Nijo Castle, boasting "nightingale" floors which squeaked to warn the inhabitants of intruders. Continue to the Heian Shrine, a two-thirds scale model of the Heian Imperial Palace surrounded by gardens. Time permitting, your tour concludes at the **Handicraft Center** for some shopping.

KYOTO & THE SHINKANSEN BULLET TRAIN







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 10 hours

Explore Kyoto by coach, stopping at the Kinkaku-ji **Temple** for an exterior view. Its second and third stories are covered in pure gold foil. Next visit Nishiki Market and see local food and products. Following lunch at a local restaurant, you will visit the Heian Shrine. dedicated to Emperor Kammu, the founder of Kyoto, and Emperor Komei, the last emperor of Kyoto. Finally, stop at the Kiyomizu Temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Its main hall famously hangs over the side of a cliff! Return to Kobe via the Shinkansen Bullet Train.



THE BEST OF OSAKA







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 8 hours

First visit Osaka Castle, destroyed and rebuilt many times, most recently in 1931. Next stop at **Shitennoii Temple**, built in A.D. 593 and believed to be the oldest Buddhist temple in Japan. It houses six National Treasures and many other items of cultural importance. After a Japanese-style set-menu lunch at a local restaurant, stroll through **Dotonbori**, a dense area of restaurants and amusement spots located along the south bank of the Dotonbori Canal and beloved by its residents.

HIMEJI CASTLE & GARDEN UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **5.25 hours**

Himeji Castle is known as the White Heron Castle because it sports an elegant white façade. Its imposing size and beauty and well-preserved castle grounds lend it status as both a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a National Treasure. Completed in 1609, unlike many other Japanese castles, it has never been destroyed by war, earthquake or fire. It survives today as one of the country's 12 original castles. Access the lovely Koko-en Garden from Himeji Castle. It consists of nine separate, walled gardens representing various Edo-period styles.

OSAKA & RIVER CRUISE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 4.5 hours

You'll board a dayboat in Osaka for a cruise down the river to see some of the city's manmade highlights. Watch for Osaka Castle, the Twin Towers, and City Hall on Nakanoshima Island. Back on dry land, board a motorcoach and head inland to the Sumiyoshi-Taisha **Shrine**, a Shinto place of worship dedicated to sea deities. You will transfer back to Kobe port at the end of your tour.

FUKUOKA, **JAPAN**



BULLET TRAIN & KOKURA CASTLE PARK







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 7 hours

Board one of Japan's famous bullet trains, traveling up to 170 mph. In Kokura transfer by coach to **Kokura** Castle, originally constructed in 1602, destroyed by fire in 1837 and rebuilt in 1959. Visit the small museum with spectacular top-floor views and stroll through the beautiful garden. Taste Japanese tea in the garden area and visit the serene Yasaka shrine nearby. Sit down to a delicious lunch before a narrated drive by airconditioned coach brings you back to Hakata.

YANAGAWA CANAL PUNTING & THE TACHIBANA OHANA MUSEUM







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6 hours

In Yanagawa explore the pretty, willow-lined canals in a donko-bune, a gondola-like punt poled by a boatman. Continue to the Tachibana Ohana Museum, housed in the former estate of the Tachibana clan that once ruled Yanagawa. Exhibits include art objects and artifacts chronicling the history of the clan as well as armor and swords, exquisite clothing, Noh masks and costumes, paintings, scrolls and an impressive collection of dolls. Enjoy **lunch** at a local restaurant here before returning to the ship.

KUSHIDA & DAZAIFU TENMANGU SHRINES & FUKUOKA TOWER





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **5 hours**

Dedicated in A.D. 905. Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine commemorates a Heian official renowned for his learning and his purity of heart. The current shrine dates to 1591 and features elegant, Buddhist-inspired bridges, serene ponds and ancient camphor trees. Browse for souvenirs along the street. Continue to the Kushida Shrine, founded in 758. It is the starting point for the Oiyama

race that ends the city's annual summer festival. You'll also visit the iconic Fukuoka Tower, a city landmark and Japan's largest seaside tower at 767 feet tall. Covered in 8,000 semi-mirrored panels, it functions as a broadcast antenna for TV and radio networks.

DAZAIFU TENMANGU SHRINE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

The **Dazaifu shrine** is dedicated to ninth-century scholar Sugawara no Michizane. His character was so admired, there are now 12.000 shrines dedicated to him across Japan. Established early in the 10th century, Dazaifu Tenmangu is perhaps the most famous of these and is well-known for its 6,000-plus plum trees that blossom in early spring. Return to the ship afterwards via motorcoach.

HIGHLIGHTS OF FUKUOKA





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.5 hours

First pass an area known as **Tenjin**, part of Fukuoka's business and entertainment center and home to major department stores and specialty shops. You'll also see the Fukuoka Dome, Japan's first baseball stadium with a retractable roof. Nearby stands the iconic Fukuoka Tower, a city landmark and Japan's largest seaside tower. Your next stop is Fukuoka's oldest shrine, the Kushida Shrine, where local merchants pray for prosperity and health and the centerpiece of a 1,200 year-old festival called Yamakasa. Next head to the Hakata Machiya Folk Museum, housed in three machiya (traditional townhouses) that provide a recreation of a traditional Hakata neighborhood. View displays of historical photographs and artifacts and watch artisans demonstrate the making of crafts.

BEIJING & THE FORBIDDEN CITY







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 11 hours

Classical Chinese architecture and cultural wealth are on display in the **Forbidden City** in Beijing. The city was originally built as a dwelling for the Ming and Qing dynasties and covers an area of 250 acres. After lunch at a hotel restaurant, stop at Tiananmen Square, the very heart of Beijing. Continue to the Temple of Heaven, a group of temples and buildings in a walled park south of Beijing. After some time to enjoy this remarkable setting, you will return to the ship via the highway to Tianjin.

BEST OF TIANJIN






Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6 hours

Begin with a visit to the Confucius Temple and the Ancient Culture Street, depicting aspects of life in China. Lunch is served at a local restaurant before the tour continues at the Tianjin Museum. This state-of-theart museum tells the history of Tianjin but also boasts a large collection of arts and crafts treasures. Visit the Shi Family Mansion, built in 1875 and covering more than 60,000 square feet. Its 12 courtyards now house the local Folklore Museum whose brick, wood and stone carvings are among the best in north China.

HUTONGS BY RICKSHAW & CIXI'S SUMMER PALACE







In Beijing enjoy a tour through the local hutongs, narrow streets of the Old Town lined with courtyard-style houses. Traveling by rickshaw, explore the alleys around the Houhai area. You will visit a local family to learn about the regional culture and the people's life here. Lunch is served at a local Chinese restaurant. Continue on to the Summer Palace, dating back to the Qing




THE GREAT WALL OF CHINA





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 10.5 hours

Take a three-and-a-half hour scenic drive to the Great Wall area. You'll enjoy lunch at a local Chinese restaurant and a shopping break at a jade crafts store. Explore the Great Wall of China, whose construction began as early as the eighth century B.C. Construction reached its zenith under the Ming Dynasty, and today the wall stretches some 3,600 miles. Your visit features a walk along a restored section of the wall and its battlements, which are wide enough to allow cavalry and chariots to pass.

DALIAN FAVORITES







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately **7 hours**

You will be welcomed into the home of local Dalian residents and have the chance to talk to your hosts through an English-speaking interpreter to learn about their everyday life and customs. Next visit the Pole Aquarium followed by a lunch of northern Chinese cuisine. After lunch, continue to People's Square in the center of Dalian, once named Stalin Square. Visit one of the thousands of nursery schools in Dalian and spend some time with the adorable children before returning to the ship.

DALIAN HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: Easy Approximately 3.25 hours

Begin with a visit to People's Square, dating back to 1899. Visit one of the thousands of nursery schools in Dalian and spend some time with these adorable



children before taking a scenic drive to Beida Bridge, completed in 1987 to commemorate Dalian's friendly relationship with its Japanese sister city, Kitakyushu. The last stop on your tour is Labor Park, the largest public park in Dalian. It offers a panoramic view of the city and its many new construction sites.

PANORAMIC DALIAN





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.5 hours

Begin your tour of Dalian with a panoramic drive around Zhongshan Square (People's Square) as your guide explains a brief history of the buildings lining the square. Built in 1899 by the Russians, this is the oldest square in Dalian. Next, drive to Lushan Hill, which is connected to Labor Park, for a panoramic view of the city. Head through the city and along its main street, Zhongshan Road en route to Xinghai Square. This large square was built in 1997 to commemorate the return of Hong Kong to China. Continue with an orientation drive along Dalian's most beautiful coastal road and enjoy the scenery along with a photo stop at Beida Bridge before returning to the ship.

THE TRAM & EASTERN DALIAN





Start your tour with a leisurely walk through Dalian's Russian Culture Street. The highlight today is a tram tour through eastern Dalian. The Chinese government removed most of the tramways in Dalian, and only one tramway with three trams was preserved and is operating for sightseeing in the Old Town area. Your next stop will be at Star & Sea Square. This large square was built in 1997 to commemorate the return of Hong Kong to China. The square offers views of the massive Dalian International Convention Center and the nearby sea.

ZHUJIAJIAO WATERTOWN







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 7.75 hours

Visit the small town of **Zhujiajiao** and admire its meandering streets, narrow alleyways, numerous stone bridges and centuries-old buildings. Local women display their handmade wares from wooden boats bobbing in the water. Explore the Daging Youju Post Office, dating to the Qing dynasty, and visit the Tongtianhe Chinese Pharmacy. Following lunch at a local restaurant, visit a silk factory and learn how traditional Chinese silk products are made, with the opportunity to shop at the factory store.

BEST OF SHANGHAL





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 10 hours

Stop first at the Shanghai Museum, which houses a vast collection. In the Pudong New Area, view the futuristic Oriental Pearl TV and Radio Tower, a symbol of the city. Travel along Shanghai's premier attraction, the Bund. Enjoy a Chinese lunch at a fine restaurant before visiting the Yuyuan Garden. Finally, visit the Jade Buddha Temple. Featuring bright saffron walls, it houses two jade Buddha statues. The centerpiece is a six-foot-tall, white jade seated Buddha encrusted with jewels.

HIGH-SPEED TRAIN TO HANGZHOU & WEST LAKE CRUISE







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **13 hours**

Travel by high-speed train to Hangzhou and discover the tranquility of West Lake during a leisurely boat ride. Enjoy a Chinese lunch before visiting Lingvin Temple. Restored several times by ancient dynasties, it now stands as one of the largest and most-visited Buddhist temples in China. This quiet and sheltered sanctuary is surrounded by forested hills. Reboard the high-speed train for your return to Shanghai.

YUYUAN GARDEN, WEST LAKE & HANGZHOU OVERNIGHT







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **18.5 hours**

This Overnight brings you to charming Hangzhou, which the great explorer Marco Polo considered one of the most beautiful and elegant cities in the world.

Day 1 (Lunch/Dinner)

Leave the ship and board an air-conditioned motorcoach. You'll drive to the famed 16th-century Yuyuan Garden, which captures the essence of the landscape art and architectural style of the Ming and Qing dynasties. In the **Old Town** area of Shanghai, wander among a maze of narrow alleys and cobblestone lanes. A 1.5-hour train **journey** through the countryside brings you to the lovely city of Hangzhou. Check in at the hotel upon arrival, with the evening at leisure.

Day 2 (Breakfast/Lunch)

IMPERIAL HUE







Drive through the Hai Van tunnels from Da Nang, arriving at Hue's Imperial Citadel. Reconstruction has restored this building to its former splendor. A buffet Imperial Feast **lunch** is served at a local hotel. Afterwards drive through pine forests and orchards to visit one of the imperial tombs. Each tomb was meant as a place of recreation before being utilized as a final resting place. Tu Duc Tomb resembles a miniature royal palace with an attractive pavilion overlooking a lake, ornate buildings, gardens and hunting grounds.

BEST OF ANCIENT HOLAN







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 7.5 hours

Take a guided walk through Hoi An's narrow streets boasting 19th-century wooden buildings. Visit a traditional merchant's house with its mix of architectural



styles. Enjoy some free time for exploring and shopping in town. Lunch, featuring exquisitely subtle Vietnamese flavors, is served at a local restaurant. Before returning to the ship, pause at My Khe Beach, a favorite military recreation spot during the Vietnam War. Also view the Marble Mountains and a marble workshop operating right on the roadside.

Returning to Da Nang city, stop at a local restaurant for lunch. Take a rickshaw tour around the main city streets before stopping at the **Cham Museum** for a 30-minute museum introduction. The museum houses the best collection of Cham art in the world, including more than 300 sandstone and terra-cotta sculptures, many of which were excavated from the My Son site.

ANGKOR WAT OVERNIGHT ADVENTURE







Day 1 (Lunch/Dinner)

Drive to Hoi An, a charming town with narrow streets lined with wooden buildings dating back to the 19th century. Visit a traditional merchant's house to see a fusion of architectural styles and witness a handicraft production demonstration. Following lunch at a local restaurant, return to Da Nang's Cham Museum, displaying original sculptures. In the evening, fly to Siem Reap for a delectable dinner and an overnight stay.

Day 2 (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)

Following breakfast, travel to the magnificent Beng Mealea temple, an ancient structure boasting remarkable architectural details and minimal restoration. In the afternoon you will visit **Angkor Wat**, the largest temple in the world, exploring its corridors and courtyards and intricate bas reliefs depicting ancient Hindu mythology. After witnessing the sun set over the ancient walls, you will return for dinner at your hotel.

Day 3 (Breakfast/Lunch)

Fly to Saigon, also known as Ho Chi Minh City. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before embarking on a drive past iconic landmarks such as the Notre Dame Cathedral, Opera House, City Hall and the Presidential Palace. Arrive at Phu My port, where your ship waits.

CU CHI TUNNELS

A tour of the city presents views of grand old buildings and colorful street markets. Visit the former Presidential Palace, now known as Independence Palace, serving as a museum. See the President's quarters and the basement with American communications equipment and strategic military maps. Drive by Notre Dame Cathedral before enjoying a buffet lunch at a local hotel. Visit the History Museum and its collection of artifacts illustrating the evolution of the cultures of Vietnam. Browse, shop and observe at a lacquerware workshop.

VUNG TAU HIGHLIGHTS





Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **4 hours**

Vung Tau has always been a popular beach resort for residents of Saigon. Drive along the coast past a 100-foot-tall statue of Jesus and visit a hillside **Buddhist** temple with attractive views. Further on you will see the so-called **Bay of Boats** where colorful wooden fishing boats are anchored. A visit to the former Royal Residence of Bach Dinh, the White Villa, is included.

BA RIA: A LOCAL LIFE EXPERIENCE





Activity Level: Easy Approximately 3.5 hours

Visit a pagoda and drive past the local market for a glimpse of everyday rural life. Next, visit a local home and visit with the owners as they talk about their simple but traditionally rich lifestyle. Then see the process of rice papermaking and a distillery producing the local potent form of rice wine. Finally, step inside a colorful Cao Dai temple. Cao Daism is a fascinating combination of Eastern and Western religions.

Alongside professional chefs, you will discover the art of Vietnamese gastronomy and will savor your creations in a relaxing ambiance. The chef is available during lunch to comment on Vietnamese cuisine and food preparation.

AROUND THE ISLAND







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **6.5 hours**

Begin at the Tiong Bahru Wet Market as locals buy their daily groceries and vegetables. Next, pass by the Kranji Dam area and the Kranji War Memorial, the final resting place for many Allied soldiers who lost their lives in World War II. After lunch visit the Bright Hill Temple, a place of Chinese ancestral worship. The final loop of the tour passes the Johore Battery, built by the British in 1939. Drive through Changi Village on the way back to the pier.

SINGAPORE BY RIVERBOAT & TRISHAW


HOLY COLOMBO

An air-conditioned motorcoach is your transportation for the three-hour journey to the **Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage**. Established in 1975, the facility became a conservation and educational center. The success

story of Pinnawela has drawn the attention of scientists from all over the world, and a considerable number of books and research articles on Pinnawela have been published in several languages. During your time at the orphanage, you will watch these gentle giants playing, eating and bathing in the river before enjoying your own riverside **lunch**.

Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **7.25 hours**

Visit the Millennium Elephant Foundation (MEF), a nonprofit organization caring for captive elephants since the early 1960s. Enjoy a close-up encounter with these majestic animals, helping to bathe and feed them. You'll also tour a paper factory which uses traditional methods to make paper from elephant dung and other ingredients such as rice paddy straw, cinnamon and banana bark.

Activity Level: **Easy**Approximately **1.5 hours**

Continue past Chowpatty Beach and many charmingly illuminated Victorian buildings, including Victoria (Chhatrapati Shivaji) Terminus, the main railway station. MARVELS OF MUMBAI

As you enter, you will see a magnificent sculpture of Shiva as Nataraj. Later, board the motor boat for the return to the Gateway and the transfer back to the ship.

BANGANGA & KHOTACHIWADI HERITAGE







Activity Level: Strenuous
Approximately 3.5 hours

Visit the temple complex of Banganga, one of Mumbai's holiest sites and the oldest surviving structure in the city. Its pool's waters are believed to have healing powers and be as sacred as the Ganges. Next, drive to the neighborhood of Khotachiwadi to view a cluster of centuries-old Portuguese-style homes. Enjoy beverages and light snacks while listening to stories from one of its residents, fashion designer James Ferriera. Pass through the Gateway of India en route back to the ship.

Approximately 2.75 hours



Drive through the Hajar Mountains to reach Nizwa, the former capital of Oman. Its 17th-century fort boasts a long and exciting history. At the back of the fort are the remains of the falai, the ancient irrigation system developed around 500 B.C. Next visit the traditional souk famed for silver Bedouin daggers. Drive to Bahla Fort, a 15th-century UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then visit Jabrin Castle, also known as the Palace of Bilyaroub and one of Oman's most beautiful forts. Lunch is served at a local restaurant en route to Muscat.

Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 7.75 hours

Depart from Salālah port and head to the soug to enjoy some free time for shopping. At the archaeological site of Al-Baled view exhibits about the region's human history and heritage. Visit Tagah Castle and continue to Khor Rori Creek, believed to be the site of Sumhuram, ancient capital of Arabia's frankincense trade, and the Queen of Sheba's palace. Enjoy lunch at a hotel in Salālah. On your way back to the ship, view Mughsail Beach and the natural blowholes in the rock cliffs.

THE FRANKINCENSE TRAIL & THE TOMB OF JOB

Next, tap your own **frankincense tree** to capture the precious perfume once valued as highly as gold. According to legend, the tomb of the Old Testament prophet Job can be found nearby. Traveling by **four-wheel-drive** vehicle from the port, you'll stop briefly at Thumrait. Continue to the Khadaf **Dunes** at the edge of the Rub Al Khali Desert and drive amid the red sand dunes. The **Ubar excavation site**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is located near the village of Shishr. Several small archaeological excavations have

revealed an area that is believed to consist of four cities. Enjoy a picnic-style lunch before you return to Salālah via Thumrait.

Activity Level: Easy Approximately 4.25 hours

Visit the palm groves of Kibbutz Eilot and learn about the history of palm trees in the Jewish culture and the burgeoning palm industry of today. Next, drive through the salt pools to the fugarot, a 1,300-year-old chain of connected wells. Visit a local shopping mall before driving into the red granite **Eilat Mountains**. The top of Mount Yoash offers sweeping views over Jordan, Egypt and Saudi Arabia. Learn about Eilat city, the region, and local flora and fauna before returning to the pier.

EILAT MOUNTAINS & DESERT HOSPITALITY







Activity Level: Strenuous
Approximately 4.75 hours

Drive into the red granite **Eilat Mountains**, a landscape dotted with acacia trees and herds of ibex. Pass through Wadi Solomon and along the Rechavam River, whose riverbed will likely be dry. See part of the pilgrimage route from Jordan to Mecca and descend to Ein Netafim. the only freshwater spring in the area. MASADA & THE DEAD SEA





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 10.5 hours

Drive to the Judean desert via Arad. Descend 1,200 feet by road to the lowest place on the Earth. Visit the Masada Fortress looming high above the desolate landscape. Once King Herod's luxurious refuge, it was the site of a three-year-long Roman siege that ended when almost a thousand members of the Jewish faith took their lives rather than submit to slavery. Next, enjoy lunch at a hotel on the shores of the **Dead Sea** and take an afternoon swim in the sea. Finally, return to Eilat and the ship.

THE ROSE-RED CITY OF PETRA








Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 12.5 hours

Experience **Petra**, the amazing rose-red city of the Nabataeans. It lies isolated in a valley so cleverly concealed that it was once "lost" for a thousand years. Walk into the city through a stunning natural canyon called the Siq. Suddenly you emerge from its gloom into the blinding light, with the Treasury before you. Pass the street of the façades leading to the Greek theater. It seats around 3,000 spectators. As you approach it, you'll pass the Royal Tombs, carved into the face of Jebel Khubtha. Leading west is the main street of Petra, which once boasted numerous stately columns. At the end of the street, to the left of the path, is the partly restored **Qasr Al Bint**. This, the only freestanding structure in Petra, is thought to have been the main place of worship in the city. Mountains surround this extraordinary place, and Bedouin families still inhabit the surrounding areas. Lunch is included and will be served buffet-style at a five-star hotel restaurant at Wadi Mussa.



AL 'AQABAH (PETRA), **JORDAN**



AQABA HIGHLIGHTS & WADI RUM LUNCH







Activity Level: Moderate
Approximately 5.25 hours

View the Agaba Fort from a distance. In the heart of the city you will find the ruins of the old city of Ayla. View the site of the city gates as well as mosques, churches and the city walls. Drive to Wadi Rum, a 1.25hour journey into a red landscape of soaring peaks and plunging valleys. Arrive at the **Desert Camp** and enjoy lunch in a Bedouin tent, followed by Arabian tea and local delicacies. Return to the ship via motorcoach.

SHOUBAK CASTLE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 5.75 hours

Travel north of Agaba to the city of Shoubak to visit one of the best-preserved Crusader castles in Jordan. Shoubak Castle, an early 12th-century Crusader castle, perches on the side of a rocky, conical mountain 4,265 feet above sea level. Built in A.D. 1115. Shoubak was the first of many fortifications built by King Baldwin I of Jerusalem to guard the road from Egypt to Damascus. It successfully resisted a number of sieges before finally falling to Saladin troops in 1189.

WADI RUM







Activity Level: Easy Approximately 5 hours

Experience Wadi Rum on a two-hour 4x4 journey through Jordan's largest and most magnificent desert landscape. Observe ridges a thousand feet tall topped with wind-smoothed domes and slabs of rock with inscriptions in early Talmudic writing scattered throughout the valley. You will see the Seven Pillars of Wisdom Mountain and the Jebels, sandstone rock formations that rise from the Wadi floor. Arrive at the **Desert Camp** and enjoy Arabian tea and delicacies served in a huge Bedouin tent furnished with authentic carpets. Return to the ship by motorcoach.

PETRA & WADI RUM







Explore this UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World on foot with your guide. Continue exploring the desert landscapes of Jordan, following in the footsteps of British adventurer T.E. Lawrence. Drive to the famous Wadi Rum, site of the 1920s Arab Revolt championed by Lawrence. Meet with a Bedouin family and drive in a four-wheel-drive vehicle to the Valley of the Moon, taking in dramatic vistas of dunes, wind-sculpted hills and striking rock formations.

PETRA: THE ROSE-RED CITY





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 9 hours

Your tour of **Petra** begins with a walk into the city through a narrow gorge call the Sig. You suddenly emerge into the light, and there before you is the **Treasury**, the most famous of Petra's monuments. Pass the street of the façades and a series of royal tombs before arriving at the Greek theater. At the end of the main street of Petra is the partly restored Qasr Al **Bint**, the only freestanding structure in Petra. **Lunch** is included and will be served buffet-style at a five-star restaurant in the upper area of Wadi Musa.

Activity Level: **Strenuous 2 Days/1 Night**

Day 1 (Lunch/Dinner)

On the drive to Jerusalem begin with a magnificent view over the Golden City from atop the Mount of Olives; then, walk through the Garden of Gethsemane. Reboard your coach for the short drive to Mt. Zion, where you will visit the Room of the Last Supper. Enter the **Old City** via the Zion Gate for a walk through the Jewish Quarter and the Roman Cardo to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Inside the church you will see the five last Stations of the Cross. After a pleasant lunch, drive to Bethlehem. There you will visit the Church of Nativity, built above the place where Christ is said to have been born. After checking in and enjoying dinner at your hotel in Jerusalem, you'll set off on a drive around the magnificently illuminated **Old Town walls**, stopping at the Dung Gate for a moonlit visit to the Western (or Wailing) Wall.

Day 2 (Breakfast/Lunch)

After breakfast you'll leave Jerusalem via the Judean Mountains and drive through the Sharon Valley to Nazareth. You will also see the Church of St. Joseph, where Joseph's carpentry workshop is believed to have stood. Next, it's back on the motorcoach for the drive to the Sea of Galilee to enjoy lunch on its shores, then you will drive by the Mount of the Beatitudes. Continue to Capernaum, St. Peter's village, where Jesus lived during his ministry in the Galilee region. See the ancient synagogue and the archaeological excavations of the 2,000-year-old village. Finally, visit the Yardenit baptismal site by the Jordan River, and at the conclusion of two exciting days in Israel, your motorcoach will bring you to Haifa's port where you will reboard the ship. **Notes**: You must bring your passport

PETRA, MASADA & THE DEAD SEA **OVERNIGHT TOUR**







Activity Level: Strenuous 2 Days/1 Night

Day 1 (Lunch/Dinner)

Leave Ashdod port and drive to Masada Fortress, located in the Judean Desert and looming high above the Dead Sea's desolate landscape. A cable car will take you to the summit for a walk around the site of this last stand. Among the fascinating landmarks are the casement wall, the Northern palace, the synagogue, cisterns, the Western palace and the Roman ramp. Back down on the desert floor, you will drive to a hotel on the shores of the **Dead Sea** to enjoy a buffet lunch in the lowest place on the surface of our planet. After lunch you'll have the opportunity to take an "unsinkable" swim in the extremely salty, mineral-rich water of the Dead Sea. In the late afternoon you will **drive** south to the Arava Border Crossing and enter Jordan. Your coach will take you to your hotel near Petra in time for dinner at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the Inbal Jerusalem Hotel (or similar) after an exciting and memorable day.



Day 2 (Breakfast/Lunch)

After an early breakfast and hotel check-out, spend the morning hours exploring the magnificent site of Petra - a UNESCO World Heritage Site. At the entrance, horses are available for the 10-minute walk to the Sig Canyon. Leaving Petra before noon, you will stop for a buffet lunch at a local restaurant; then, drive north to the Sheikh Hussein/Jordan River Border Crossing. An Israeli guide and coach will be waiting to transfer you to Haifa Port and your ship. **Notes**: There is a strenuous walk of at least 6 miles (each way) into and out of the Petra site along an inclined path with slippery and unpaved surfaces, and temperatures are high – easily 105°F at Petra. Please realistically assess your physical fitness and ability prior to booking.

Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **10.25 hours**

Drive through the Jezre'el Valley to Nazareth, childhood home of Jesus and the City of the Annunciation. Visit the Church of the Annunciation and the Church of St. Joseph. Drive on via Cana, where Jesus performed his first miracle, to the Sea of Galilee, and enjoy lunch there. Next, drive to Tabgha to visit the Church of the Primacy of Peter, and Capernaum, St. Peter's village. Continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount, and then to the Yardenit baptismal site on the Jordan River.

GOLAN HEIGHTS & GALILEE







Activity Level: **Moderate**Approximately **9 hours**

Drive from Haifa to Mount Carmel, a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, and onward to Zippori National Park, encompassing ruins from the Roman and Talmudic eras. Drive on toward the Sea of Galilee and Tiberias, stopping at a kibbutz to learn about the everyday life of these communities. After lunch, stop at Yardenit and then ascend the Golan Heights, offering breathtaking vistas of the Sea of Galilee, the Jordan Valley and Northern Galilee. Drive along the shores of the Sea of Galilee and visit Capernaum.

Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **5 hours**

Begin with a visit to the Virgin Mary's House, a Catholic shrine. In **Ephesus**, visit the Great Theatre, where St. Paul preached to the Ephesians. The Marble Road leads you to the Celsus Library and Hadrian's Temple.

Dedicated in A.D. 118, it features beautiful reliefs on the porch. Return to Kuşadasi to enjoy an **optional** carpet demonstration while sipping traditional Turkish apple tea. You may stay in town to **shop** or explore independently or make your own way back to the ship on foot.

EPHESUS & THE TERRACE HOUSES





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 4 hours

Visit the ruined city of ancient **Ephesus** and see the glorious Celsus Library façade, restored and reconstructed in the 1970s; the Great Theatre; and Temple of Hadrian. Don't miss the Terrace Houses located opposite Hadrian's Temple. The wealthy and important people of Ephesus lived in these houses, which are finely decorated with mosaics and frescoes. giving a true impression of the ancient lifestyle. Back in Kuşadasi, you may shop in town, watch an optional carpet demonstration, or return directly to the ship.

A TASTE OF KUŞADASI: THE VILLAGE OF SIRINCE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 6 hours

Visit Sirince village, the perfect synthesis of Turkish and Greek culture. Stroll the streets to see its typical Greek houses, and opt to purchase handicrafts sold by the residents at street stalls. Taste some of the local grape and fruit wines, and enjoy lunch served in a Turkish **home** – a chance to sample the cuisine and embrace the village culture. After you try a cup of strong Turkish coffee, a fortune-teller will read your coffee cup! On your return to **Kuşadasi**, you will have time for an optional carpet demonstration and shopping.

Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 3.75-8 hours

Notice its shoreline is bedecked with traditional wooden villas. 19th-century Ottoman palaces, fishing villages and green hills. Note: This excursion can be purchased as a standalone tour, but for the best experience should be combined with Deluxe Istanbul Part II.

Part II: A short drive through the Old Town brings you to the ancient **Hippodrome**. From there it is a short walk to the **Blue Mosque**, named for the blue Iznik tiles covering its walls. Nearby lies the Topkapi Palace, the official residence of the Ottoman sultans. Browse here on your own and then enjoy lunch at an authentic Ottoman-style restaurant. Afterward step inside the famous Hagia Sophia, completed in A.D. 537 as an Orthodox church but now serving as a mosque. En route to the port, stop for a carpet demonstration and at the Grand Bazaar for some shopping.

Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 7.25 hours

Visit the **Spice Market** and watch trading as it has been done for centuries. Stop also at the Beyoglu Farmers' Market to learn about ingredients that go into Turkish cuisine. See the largest fish market in Istanbul and then eniov lunch at a local kebab house. Stroll the alleys of the Grand Bazaar and take in a demonstration of carpet weaving.

HISTORY & SCENIC CRUISE WITH A PRIVATE GUIDE





Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **5 hours**

Board a private yacht with a private guide to take in the city's landmarks from the water as your guide recounts Istanbul's colorful history. You'll stop for refreshments at an authentic Turkish teahouse then enjoy time at the Grand Bazaar and a demonstration of carpet weaving.

Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **5 hours**

First stop at the Blue Mosque, named for its richly adorned interior of blue Iznik tiles. Nearby lies the Topkapi Palace, official residence of the Ottoman sultans and consisting of courts, pavilions and mosques. Enjoy browsing on your own, then stop for a carpet demonstration and visit the Grand Bazaar to shop en route back to the pier.

THE BEST OF ISTANBUL







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **7.5 hours**

Visit the impressive **Blue Mosque** and take a short walk to the ancient **Hippodrome**. Browse on your own at the amazing Topkapi Palace, official residence of the Ottoman sultans. After **lunch** at a city hotel, you'll stop at the magnificent sixth-century Hagia Sophia, which has served as church, museum and mosque. Pause at the **Grand Bazaar** for a little shopping and a demonstration of carpet weaving.

Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 7.5 hours

Lunch with wine is served at a local venue followed by a stop at Kalafatis Beach, where refreshments are available (at your expense). On a guided walking tour explore Mykonos labyrinth-like streets. INSIDER'S MYKONOS







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3 hours

This walking tour through Mykonos town showcases the lifestyle and the true history of this unique settlement. Step inside the Maritime Museum and stroll through narrow streets packed with whitewashed houses. In picture-perfect Little Venice, the famous windmills of Mykonos offer a wonderful photo opportunity. At the conclusion of your tour, enjoy a

PANORAMIC MYKONOS ISLAND







Activity Level: Moderate
Approximately 3 hours

Visit the quaint villages of loannis, Ornos and Kalafatis, then continue to Ano Mera, perhaps the most traditional of the island's villages. Visit the Monastery of Panagia Tourliani, dating to the 18th century. Inside the chapel are icons depicting scenes from the New Testament. At the main square of Ano Mera, ouzo and Greek mezedes (snacks) will be served before you return to the port.

ANCIENT DELOS IN 3D





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 4 hours

Board a local **ferry** to the ancient island of **Delos**, said to be the birthplace of Apollo and his twin sister, Artemis. Its numerous ruins are important to Greek history, and today you will see them with the aid of Augmented Reality Software (AR). Simply point a tablet's camera at various locations and view them as they stood thousands of years ago. Narration is provided by an archaeologist, offering great insight into the history, architecture and significance of the sanctuary.

MYTHOLOGICAL DELOS






Cross on a ferry to the ancient site of Delos, mythical birthplace of Apollo and his twin sister. Artemis. The sacred island is uninhabited, but its earliest settlements date to the third millennium B.C. A walking tour enables you to see one of the most revered sanctuaries of antiquity and other sites: the Sanctuary of Apollo complex, the area of the Sacred Lake, the Terrace of Lions, the sanctuaries on Cynthus and the theater and commercial harbor districts.

PIRAEUS (ATHENS), GREECE NAPLES (POMPEII), ITALY

PIRAEUS (ATHENS), **GREECE**



ACROPOLIS, ANCIENT AGORA & TEMPLE OF OLYMPIAN ZEUS







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **7.5 hours**

Your **guided walking tour** begins as you climb up to the Acropolis. Take in the city views and the Parthenon, the Erectheum and the Porch of the Caryatids. Next, sample regional delicacies and taste flavorful local wines at lunch. Next visit the ancient Agora and browse in the Stoa of Attalos Museum. View the Thission Temple and take time to **shop** and purchase refreshments if you wish. On a drive through Athens, stop at the Old Olympic Stadium and the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the largest temple in antiquity.

ATHENS. THE ACROPOLIS & **CAPE SOUNION**







Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 8.5 hours

En route to the **Temple of Poseidon** at Sounion, you'll pass marinas and resort towns. Built in the fifth century B.C., it sits 180 feet above the sea with magnificent views of the blue Aegean. On your way to Athens, stop at a leading Greek taverna for lunch. Afterwards, visit the **Acropolis**, high above the city. Pass Hadrian's Arch, marking the border between the ancient Greek and Roman cities. You will pass the Temple of Olympian Zeus, Constitution Square, the Presidential Palace and the all-marble Olympic stadium built in 1896.

ANCIENT CORINTH & MYCENAE







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 8.5 hours

Visit the famous Corinth Canal: 4 miles long, 70 feet wide and with sloping sides 170 feet high. Next stop at Ancient Corinth; see the ruins and excavations of both a sixth-century B.C. Greek city and a 44 B.C. Roman

city that existed here. After **lunch** visit the mighty ruins of ancient Mycenae, a kingdom that, for 400 years, was the most powerful in Greece. Approach the Citadel of Mycenae on foot through the famous Lion Gate. Visit the **Beehive Tomb**, known sometimes as the Tomb of Agamemnon.

A FOODIE WALK THROUGH ATHENS (A SMALL-GROUP TOUR)







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 5.25 hours

Set out with a foodie guide on this culinary and cultural walk. Taste koulouri (sesame bread), extravirgin olive oils, cheese, wine, honey, vinegars, pastourmas (cured meat), bougatsa (cream-filled pie), loukoumades (Greek donuts) and, of course, souvlaki. Visit the vendors at the Varvakios fish. meat and vegetable market, and stop at a spice store and step into a traditional coffee shop for strong java.

THE BEST OF ATHENS





Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **7.5 hours**

Visit the **Acropolis**, a symbol of the glory of ancient Greece. The Propylaea serves as the entrance to the complex of buildings. You'll see the Temple of Athena Nike (Wingless Victory); the Erechtheum with its classical Porch of Maidens, the Caryatids; and the Parthenon. Enjoy a traditional Greek lunch at a restaurant before visiting the National Archaeological Museum, boasting the world's finest collection of Greek antiquities. Finally, a scenic drive through the city takes you past its important landmarks: the 1896 marble Olympic stadium, Hadrian's Arch and the former Royal Palace. At the plaka (Old Town) area you'll take a quided walking tour of the historical center of Athens, with free time allocated for **shopping**.

NAPLES (POMPEII), ITALY



ULTIMATE BAY OF NAPLES: POMPEII. POSITANO & AMALFI COAST







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **9.5 hours**

Explore the excavated ruins of **Pompeii** on a two-hour walking tour. Your guide interprets the remains of the well-preserved city and how its aristocratic inhabitants lived lavishly. You will see the forum, amphitheater, gymnasium, shops and an aqueduct and view detailed mosaics and frescoes adorning the interiors of some villas. Enjoy a four-course meal with Prosecco here or on the Amalfi Coast. Travel to Positano, a lovely town built into a sheer cliff. Enjoy a leisurely hour to explore the town or **shop** for souvenirs.

A CRUISE TO THE ISLE OF CAPRI







Activity Level: **Strenuous**Approximately **8 hours**

Begin with a jetfoil ride to the island of Capri, taking in several lovely sights, including Capri Town and Anacapri. A delicious, traditional Italian lunch is served there. Roman emperors, including Caesar Augustus and Tiberius, vacationed on the island, and you'll see the remains of their magnificent Roman villas. Capri is a popular destination for artists and the wealthy. This tour, although escorted, is unstructured, so you will have free time to explore, browse or **shop**.

THE BEST OF SORRENTO & **AMALFI COAST CRUISE**







Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **9.25 hours**

Drive to **Salerno** and board a motorlaunch for a 60-minute cruise along the gorgeous Amalfi Coast. In Amalfi town you'll have 60 minutes of free time to explore the town and visit the Amalfi Cathedral. The Cloister of Paradise houses the tombs of Amalfi's wealthy merchants and leads into the Basilica of the Crucifix and its amazing frescoes. Return to Salerno

and drive to **Sorrento** for an authentic **meal** using fresh, seasonal ingredients from Campania. Spend an hour at your leisure to **shop** or relax. Visit a local **cameo factory** before returning to Naples.

POMPEII & HIKE TO THE SUMMIT OF MT. VESUVIUS





Activity Level: Strenuous
Approximately 6.5 hours

Drive south from Naples to Mt. Vesuvius, the still-active volcano that buried Pompeii in A.D. 79. Begin your hike to the volcano's crater at 3,000 feet above sea level. As you walk across hardened lava, crevices still belch fumes, steam and heat. Next visit a local cameo factory and shop for handmade jewelry. Stop at a local café where you may purchase lunch (at your expense). Walk through the excavations at Pompeii with your guide, who will point out the well-preserved remains that reveal the Romans' customs, buildings and cuisine, as well as how they entertained, decorated and lived. Return by coach to Naples.

INSIDER'S POMPEII & NAPLES ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately **7 hours**

A walking tour of Pompeii led by a historian guide reveals the luxurious mansions and fabulous art of its wealthy residents. Visit some of the more modest homes, and explore ancient baths, temples, theaters, marketplaces and the huge forum. Enjoy a typical Italian lunch at a local restaurant. Visit the Archaeological Museum of Naples and its collections of sculptures, bronzes, ceramics, paintings, mosaics, jewelry and other works of art from this ancient civilization. Don't miss the "secret cabinet" (opening hours permitting), a collection of erotic and sexually explicit finds from Pompeii.

MÁLAGA SIGHTS & THE PICASSO MUSEUM





Activity Level: Strenuous Approximately 4 hours

View from the outside the **Alcazaba**, an 11th-century residence of the Arabian caliphs (kings) that is connected by a steep path to the Gibralfaro Castle, an ancient Moorish fortress with breathtaking views of the city and the bay. Your coach will transport you up the hill to visit the castle. Next visit the Museo Picasso Málaga, where you will have time to appreciate all Picasso's styles and techniques (painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics, graphic works) along with an exhibition with pieces dating from 1890 to 1973.

BEST OF CÓRDOBA







Córdoba was established by the Romans but did not reach its prime until the 10th century, the time of Muslim domination in Iberia. Today you will enter a forest of columns that belonged to the mosque of **Córdoba** and discover within it a Catholic cathedral. built when Catholicism overthrew Islam. Complete your time in Córdoba with a walking tour through the Jewish Quarter. Your quide will point out the Mudejar Synagogue and the quarter's many references to water; Arabian engineering was crucial for the development of the area's supply. Enjoy **lunch** at a local restaurant.

MIJAS VILLAGE & COUNTRYSIDE





Activity Level: **Strenuous**Approximately **4 hours**

Drive to Mijas, a typical Spanish village with a strong Andalusian flavor and coastline views. All the houses in Mijas are painted white, and the layout of the streets was planned to protect the houses and residents from the areas's strong winds. Experience a pleasant, if somewhat unusual, sightseeing ride via donkey taxis (at your own expense). Shop the local stores for ceramics, handmade wood items or other locally made crafts and souvenirs.

GRANADA & THE ALHAMBRA







Activity Level: Strenuous

On the drive to **Granada**, your guide will introduce you to the local traditions and history of this beautiful city. Nothing in all of Spain, however, compares to the wealth of architectural art found in the 14th-century Alhambra. This breathtaking example of Muslim architecture, surrounded by walls and towers, includes palaces, military buildings, a fortress and an administrative center. Explore its detailed mosaics, prism-style cupolas and stone-cast latticework of surprising grace and sophistication. You will see the Nazrid Palace, the Generalife summer residence and the gardens. Lunch is included.

CAMINITO DEL REY HIKE



Activity Level: **Strenuous**Approximately **6 hours**

Drive to the Caminito del Rey, a trail that crosses the beautiful Gaitanes Ravine. Set out on this stunning walkway carved into cliffs that soar heavenward above the path and plunge hundreds of feet below it. Walk approximately 3.5 hours from Ardales to Álora, learning about the flora and fauna of the gorge as well as some interesting facts about its geology, history and role in the region's production of electricity. Reboard your motorcoach to return to the ship.



PONTA DELGADA, **AZORES**



BEST OF THE AZORES: FURNAS VALLEY & HOT SPRINGS







Activity Level: **Moderate** Approximately **8 hours**

Visit a local **tea plantation** and factory, sampling some of the better-known Azorean blends. Continue up to the lake to see your lunch being taken out of an earthen oven, heated using geothermal power. Dine on this special lunch at the Casino Terra Nostra. Visit the Terra Nostra Botanic Gardens, featuring a naturally heated swimming pool - you'll have time for a quick **swim** if you wish. Visit some **hot springs** to learn about the different mineral water sources; then return to Ponta Delgada via Vila Franca, the island's first capital.

OFF THE BEATEN TRACK: AZORES





Activity Level: **Strenuous** Approximately **3.25 hours**

Traveling by **smaller vehicle**, you'll discover some places inaccessible to buses while your driver details the island's history. Climb to Sete Cidades Crater Lake and watch for trees indigenous to the Azores, hydrangeas and other varieties of flora. The surrounding region of vast farmland is the breadbasket of the Azores, providing food and wealth for the inhabitants of the islands. Interestingly, the land here is worked using ageold traditions.



A TASTE OF AZORES







Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.75 hours

Sete Cidades, the seven cities region, is dominated by an impressive 5-mile-wide caldera. Within the crater lie two lakes — one green and the other blue. See the lakes from the highest point and also at close guarters. The village of Sete Cidades sits at the edge of the blue lake, surrounded by forest-covered walls. Enjoy some free time in one of the oldest villages of the Azores. On the way back to Ponta Delgada, you will also see Santiago Lake. Savor a small tasting of Azorean wines and cheeses at a Ponta Delgada hotel with port and city views.

SETE CIDADES CRATER LAKE





Activity Level: Easy Approximately 3.25 hours

Head to the village of Fajã de Baixo to visit a pineapple plantation. Taste pineapple liqueur (depending upon availability), with time for souvenir shopping afterwards. Descend into the village of **Sete Cidades**, with free time for a quick coffee (at your expense) before continuing to the Santiago Lake and Vista do Rei viewpoints. Reach the main crater of the extinct volcano at 1,900 feet above sea level. Within it lie two lakes: one is blue, reflecting the sky, and the other is bright green, reflecting its beautiful setting within the crater walls.

FIRE LAKE & RIBEIRA GRANDE





Activity Level: Moderate Approximately 3.75 hours

Drive through Ponta Delgada and along the pleasant roads stretching across the island to Ribeira Grande. This oldest and largest city on the north coast has a distinct air of Portuguese influence. From Pico da Barrosa Mountain take in fine views of Fire Lake. Return to Ponta Delgada along the new road, descending towards Remedios. At a pineapple plantation learn about the process of cultivating and marketing this delicious tropical fruit.
